

A Note from the Director



Kira Blaskovich, director

Coming through a pandemic, we've all suffered personal traumas, shifts in awareness and comfort levels, new routines that were created to provide some level


of security. The world rages, and we hunker down and survive. The characters in "Ripcord" haven't survived a pandemic, or any worldwide crisis. But they are trauma survivors - the trauma of life, of aging, of pain and regret. The two main characters, Abby and Marilyn, respond to their own traumas in vastly different ways, but they share one thing in common: their space. Like a microcosm for living in this world, these women are forced to live together in a small little room, each having their routines altered, each being pushed out of their comfort zones by each other. Through facing their fears and deeper emotions, they begin to find that the space is not only big enough for two. It can be as large as the whole world if one chooses to embrace life.

I chose this play for many reasons. One main reason is the beautiful, fully-developed older women characters. There isn't a plethora of strong, funny, willful women characters in their 50's and above on stage. When a role is written for a "woman of a certain age," they are supporting roles - comedic foils or austere, dominating matriarchs. Here, in "Ripcord," we are presented

with Abby and Marilyn. They are surprising, comedic, sometimes raw, always real women.

My second reason for choosing this play is because the world feels so divided right now. When forced into isolation, we reached out and grabbed hands with those nearby, reasserting our own image of the world. We did this for safety, for reassurance. However, just like the characters in "Ripcord," we are all sharing one thing: our space. By learning from others, by trying to understand and accept others, we create a bigger world - with more than enough space for all of us.
