

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

From the Director



Evangeline "Angie" Bitsko, Director

A zany, wholesome, hilarious musical revue, *NUNSENSE* is a heavenly delight! The *Nunsense* concept originated as a line of greeting cards featuring a nun offering "tart quips." The cards caught on so quickly that composer/lyricist/director Dan Goggin decided to expand the concept into a cabaret show called *THE NUNSENSE STORY* which was eventually expanded into a full-length theater production.

At the time when the original off-Broadway production of *NUNSENSE* closed after a run of 3,672 performances, it became the second-longest running off-Broadway show in history (after *The Fantasticks*). It went on to become an international phenomenon, being translated into at least 26 languages with more than 8,000 productions worldwide. It has grossed over \$500 million worldwide and won four Outer Critics Circle Awards, including best Off-Broadway musical, best book and best music. The show's astounding success prompted

an amazing six sequels, three spin-offs, several off-Broadway and London production cast recordings, as well as a recently developed new episodic television series.

NUNSENSE offers a cornucopia of hilarity for the whole family, proving conclusively that nun rhymes with fun! The show is a hysterical spoof about the misadventures of a group of nuns trying to manage a fundraiser. Sadly, the rest of the convent kicked the bucket after being accidentally poisoned by eating botched chicken soup prepared by the convent cook, Sister Julia, Child of God. Thus, the remaining nuns – cheerleading Sister Mary Cardelia, ballet-loving Sister Mary Leo, street-wise Sister Robert Anne, befuddled Sister Mary Amnesia, mistress of the novices Sister Mary Hubert, and the tightrope-walker-turned Mother Superior Sister Mary Regina – stage a talent show in order to raise the money to bury their dearly departed. Moving at breakneck speed with a collection of catchy songs, high-stepping choreography, and madcap comedy, the Little Sisters of Hoboken are sure to tickle your funny bone and have you rolling in the aisles with laughter. *NUNSENSE* is a favorite of community theater settings and is the perfect reminder that live and local theatre is and always should be habit-forming. Enjoy!
